This new committee plans to be of service to the families who live near our congregation. The tentative agenda this year will include distribution of notices, getting to know residents, identifying needs, and putting on a Health and Services Fair in the spring.

The Criminal Justice Committee informs the congregation, the public, and our government about the need to reform our criminal justice and prison systems, and offers ways to provide support for people who are subjected to harmful policies.

Manages gifts and bequests to the Society and distributes grants from income generated by the trust's principal in furtherance of FUUSA's purposes.

Develops and implements financial policies and procedures for FUUSA in conjunction with other committees, councils, and staff.

Coordinates donations and arrangement of flowers for the sanctuary for Sunday services and, upon request, for special occasions.

Provides funds for food and other needed items, as well as volunteers to serve those in need within the Focus Churches area of Albany.

Provides a Sunday morning presentation, often on social action topics, followed by a short discussion. A project of the Social Responsibilities Council.

Acts as an agent to encourage fun events at FUUSA that will raise funds from both

Acts as an agent to encourage fun events at FUUSA that will raise funds from both members and non-members. We typically do not sponsor events ourselves, but work with ad hoc groups formed for specific events.

Our mission is to facilitate and support the work of the congregation toward affirming and promoting "respect for the interdependent web of all existence of which we are a part" (FUUSA is an accredited Green Sanctuary.)

Maintains FUUSA archives, assists with historic research on the congregation, disseminates historic information, articles, etc.
