#### Haiti relief

Our special collection on January 24th raised \$3,043 for the Unitarian Universalist Service Committee's relief effort in Haiti. Contributions can still be made through the UUA website.

#### **Board Notes**

The January meeting of the Board of Trustees was packed full of information exchanges, careful deliberations, and thoughtful decision making. Sam, Amy, and Leah kept the group's attention with interesting highlights from their monthly reports. They are certainly a busy staff, engaged in substantive work that serves our congregation well.

The concern was raised that we need more hymnals, and it was agreed that we would like to purchase thirty more of each of our two hymnals. We will offer members of the congregation another opportunity to buy and dedicate a name plate for the purchase price of a hymnal; the name plates will be placed in the new books.

On FUUSA's financial front, Dave Metz reported that things are under control, in spite of interest rates being down. He is researching the possibility of moving all our accounts to Berkshire Bank, our mortgage holder, to "get a better deal."

The Board also addressed three topics directly related to our new Strategic Plan, adopted by the congregation in December:

- Request for input from the Task Force reviewing staffing
- Creation of a new Community and Connections Committee
- A Green Sanctuary proposal that FUUSA Board Notes , continued on pg. 2

**Board Notes , cont. from pg. 1** become Carbon Neutral in its activities to reduce our impact on global warming

The Task Force on Staffing, chaired by Chuck Manning, is charged with reviewing current staffing and identifying needs for additional staff leadership and support. Appointed to carry out this charge are Dave Street, Scott Murray, Dawn Dana, Ben English, Peter Brown, and Mark Butt. Feel free to approach any of these individuals if you have ideas or issues related to our staff functions and needs.

The development of a new Community and Connections Committee holds a special key to implementing the Strategic Plan. The Board agreed on a charge for this committee which includes assessing the goals and objectives enumerated in the plan, identifying existing councils and committees already working in these areas and assessing their interest and ability to further promote the community and connection goals, and ultimately to establish means to accomplish

those goals which are not being addressed by any of our existing structures. Todd Gray and Pam Collins have agreed to do the initial leg work and research to get this committee off the ground.

Becoming a carbon neutral Society is a goal that the Social Responsibilities Council (SRC) has asked the Board to adopt, and it received full Board support. The plan is to participate in programs that reduce the carbon in the atmosphere in order to offset the processes in which we, at FUUSA, emit carbon. The Green Sanctuary committee planted this seed and is actively looking at the various ways to meet this goal. We will be putting our money where our footprint is!



# From Joy Library: books by Forrest Church

The Rev. Forrest Church, a longtime pastor at the Unitarian Church of All Souls on the Upper East Side died last September. During his lifetime, he wrote nearly two dozen books, many of which applied his theology to everyday life. They included God and Other Famous Liberals (1991), Life Lines: Holding On (and Letting Go) (1996) and Lifecraft: The Art of Meaning in the Everyday (2000).His illnesses motivated him to write Love and Death: My Journey Through the Valley of the Shadow (2008) and a final book summing up his religious philosophy, The Cathedral of the World: A Universalist Theology (2009). While battling cancer, he also completed 'So Help Me God (2007), a study of the religious views of the first five presidents. The Joy Library owns 16 books by Forrest Church. Some of them are shelved under their call numbers. Others may be


