#### Unitarian Universalists advertise in Capital Region!

Our non-dogmatic, non-evangelistic denomination is about to begin a marketing campaign right here in the Capital Region to spread our "good news." And *the good news* is Unitarian Universalism!

This campaign is the culmination of years of vision, hard work and planning by the ministers, lay leaders and members of the Albany, Glens Falls, Saratoga Springs and Schenectady congregations. In a tough economy we raised \$20,000! We all should be proud.

These funds will be used for radio underwriting on WAMC beginning Sept. 14<sup>th</sup> (26 weeks from Sept. 2009 to October

2010), a direct mail campaign to over 15,000 households at the end of September, an internet Google AdWords campaign throughout the church year, and more. All the advertising will direct people to our new Capital Region website ([www.capitalregionuu.org](http://www.capitalregionuu.org)) or to our congregation.

## Chris' Chrysalis

Last Saturday I was with my three sons and two daughters at Stony Kill Farm in Dutchess County. We shared a special moment observing a caterpillar hanging from the top of a cage constructing its chrysalis. Then I listened to my nine year old (an expert on the subject) explain to me the process that occurs during that three week period of transformation. In less than three weeks time that caterpillar will emerge as a monarch butterfly.

The image of a caterpillar in a chrysalis came to my mind when Amy suggested I come up with a title for my regular column. A chrysalis is a protective covering, a sheltered stage of being or growth. At this point in my journey I identify with that caterpillar at Stony Kill and I see FUUSA as my chrysalis. Lois Griffin, new chairperson of the Social Responsibilities Council, held a brief inaugural meeting on Sept. 6, leading a short review of on-going projects and of new ones, including a lively discussion of the Standing on the Side of Love philosophy. More will be explored on that in coming weeks.

Thayer Heath made an important announcement of the upcoming International Climate Action day, scheduled for Sat. Oct. 24, in the park near the Capitol. The event will feature a program of music, dance and speak-

ers. The aim is to call attention to a meeting planned for Dec. 7 in Copenhagen, where a new climate treaty is to be signed to replace the Kyoto Protocol.

International Climate Day is alternatively called 350.org, which is the amount of carbon per million that nations have to reach to reduce their carbon footprint. We are now in the high 300s. Representatives from a wide variety of groups are to be invited. The hope is to get FUUSA members of all ages involved in the day.

The international climate action day is designed to energize countries and cities in the US to increase awareness about the upcoming meeting on December 7 in Copenhagen to sign a new climate treaty to replace the Kyoto Protocol.
