Group	Curricula Description
Toddlers	Fun!
Pre-School	UU Play A story based program based on UU themes, with reflection time and coaching on cooperative play
Kindergarten/First Grade	Creating Home This program speaks of home as a place of belonging and explores the roles each of us play in the homes where we live. The program introduces the concept of a "faith home" — our congregation — which shares some characteristics with a family home. Like a family home, a faith home offers its members certain joys, protections, and responsibilities.
Second Grade	Wonderful Welcome This Tapestry of Faith curriculum helps children to identify intangible gifts central to Unitarian Universalism such as friendship, hospitality and fairness, and share these gifts with others
Third/Fourth Grade	Sing to the Power Sing to the Power affirms our Unitarian Universalist heritage of confronting "powers and structures of evil with justice, compassion, and the transforming power of love." Participants experience their own power, and understand how it can help them to be leaders.
Fifth Grade	Windows and Mirrors The metaphor of windows and mirrors represents the dynamic relationship among our awareness of self, our perceptions of others, and others' perceptions of us.
Sixth and Seventh Grade	Neighboring Faiths This group will first create among themselves a religious community and then learn about and visit other places of worship
Eighth and Ninth Grade	Heeding the Call: Qualities Of A Justice Maker
