In this version there may or may not be an Announcer: if there is no Announcer, the Service Leader does the Announcer's lines.

NOTE: When the children are in Children's Chapel, usually the first Sunday of the month, there will not be a child Chalice Lighter. There also will not be a children's story. On these days ask an adult to light the chalice.

**Second Ringing of the Chime** -- *Service Leader* rings small chime on stage. Chime may need to be rung twice - once to get people to stop chatting, once to signal start.
