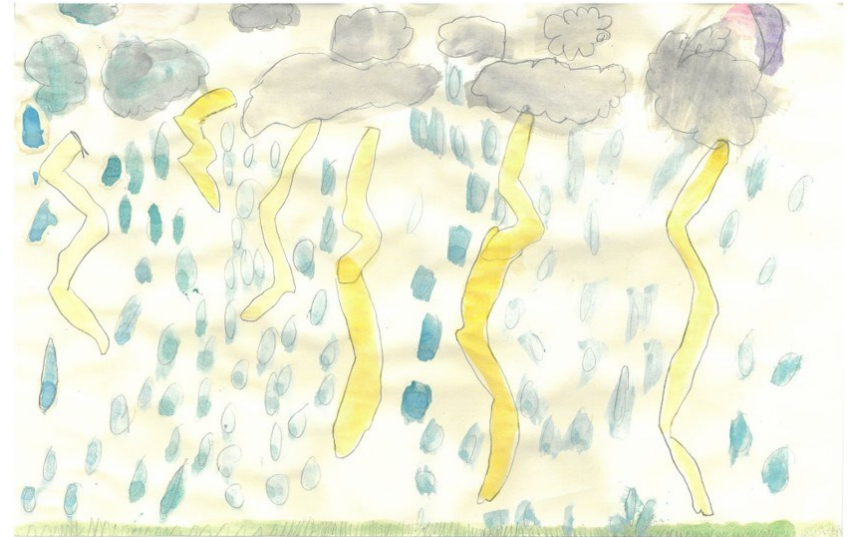
Programs for Children & Youth, Sunday, November 10th
