

It has been nearly 30 years since we're done that, and the search process and Albany UU have changed in the interim. Ranked Choice Voting in Albany

There is a non-partisan effort afoot to bring ranked-choice voting (RCV) to Albany city elections. Come learn about **RCV after the service today at 11:30 AM in Room B-3/4.**

Ranked-choice voting is a method where you indicate not only your first-choice candidate, but also your second and subsequent choices. If your first choice doesn't get enough votes your vote is automatically transferred to your second choice, and so on. With RCV, you can vote for whom you want rather than worry about vote splitting. For example, "if I vote for X, what if that lets Y beat Z?" -- a common problem with single-candidate voting -- is not an issue because if candidate X doesn't get enough votes, your vote automatically transfers to Z. We hope to see YOU there.



Share the Plate with the Refugee Welcome Center in February

This month, Albany UU will share half of the collection plate with the **West Hill Refugee Welcome Center**. West Hill has more than three times the average rate of abandoned and vacant buildings in Albany. At the same time, Albany is a major resettlement area for refugees due to its lower cost of living compared to larger cities. The nonprofit Refugee Welcome Corporation (RWC) was formed to bring together increasingly vacant housing with increasing numbers of essentially globally homeless people.

Today, with 28 residential units, RWC houses 150 people, mostly single mother-led households. RWC offers services to the neighborhood including English language classes, student homework help, and public health lessons at its Refugee Welcome Center on Ontario Street. RWC operates on very low overhead, with 97% of its spending going towards program. Learn more at rwcwesthill.com
